News of the closure was first brought to the attention of the community in September of 2014. Since this time, Town Council, Administration, Fire Department and First Responders have worked to persuade the Ministry to keep the "right in/right out" access at Main Street. In addition to repeated letters to the Ministry, the Town of Balgonie sent representatives to speak with Minister Heppner and her staff at the legislature and in Council chambers. Despite the efforts of the Council and administration, the Ministry of Highways is no altering the plans to close this vital access.

Dear Mayor Thauberger:

Thank you for meeting with Minister McMorris, myself and Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure officials on June 16, 2016, to discuss the Highway 1 and Main Street Access (Access) at Balgonie.

The safest access to and from the Town of Balgonie (Town) to Highway 1 will be the new interchange at Highway 46. This interchange has been designed to manage traffic and improve traffic safety, while recognizing the long-term growth potential of the community. The Highway 46 and Highway 1 interchange, is a major investment which will improve the safety of the residents of Balgonie. This interchange is something that we have both been working towards for a very long time, we are pleased it will be open by Fall 2017.

When Highway 46 was originally constructed, the Town Council agreed that the Access would be closed once an overpass was built at Highway 46. This was confirmed in a letter to the Town in March 1991. However, as this overpass has become an imminent reality, the Town has raised a concern regarding the closure of this Access.

The Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure (MHI) has concerns about the proximity of the Access to the new interchange at Highway 46 and the existing overpass at Highway 10, if the Access remains open. The nearby location of the Access onto Highway 1, along with the service roads adjacent to the existing intersection, creates serious safety concerns. With highway traffic increasing on Highway 1 and continued growth in and around the community of Balgonie this safety risk will only continue to increase.

As well, distances between the Access and Highways 46 and 10 interchanges are too short for the safe operation of vehicles, especially large trucks. Vehicles turning right from the Access would need to accelerate into highway traffic that is accelerating from Highway 10 and also decelerating onto Highway 46. This situation would lead to confusion and increase the risk of collisions. The speed differential at the end of the westbound acceleration lane extending from Main Street compared to highway traffic speed is also a safety concern.

The Access cannot remain open, due to the serious safety concerns previously mentioned. Closure of the Main Street Access will occur once the interchange at Highway 46 and Highway 1 is constructed, which is expected to be in the Fall of 2017. Following the closure, Main Street will be gated, allowing only emergency vehicles access. Public traffic will use Highway 46 for access to Balgonie.

MHI appreciates that the Town has raised additional concerns with potential traffic capacity issues at Highway 46 with the removal of the Access. As part of the intersection design work at Highway 46, additional turning lanes have been incorporated into the final intersection configuration to address current and future capacity issues. Understanding that there may still be concerns, MHI is prepared to continue to work with the Town to look at longer term community planning work that would consider future transportation requirements for the Town. This would include concerns with Highway 364.



2015 Waterworks Financial Overview

The following is information for the Town of Balgonie waterworks as required under *The Municipalities Regulations*.

- Total waterworks revenues \$ 865,456
- > Total waterworks expenditures—\$ 905,484
- > Total debt on waterworks infrastructure \$124,704
- > Comparison of waterworks revenues to expenditures plus debt payments (expressed as a ratio)

 $\frac{865.456}{905,484 + 124,704} = .84$

For 2015, waterworks revenues covered 84 percent of the waterworks expenditures. The construction of the new water transmission main and water reservoir was completed in 2015 and the first payment of the debenture loan was made.

- Amount transferred out of the utility reserve to cover some of the capital construction cost and deficit --\$350,000
- > Amount of 2015 supplementary funding from general revenue required to cover expenditures —\$164,73
- Reserves available for waterworks capital infrastructure \$ 669,825.56 (includes water and sewer)

 - the Waterworks Rate Policy and capital investment strategy
 - 2015 financial overview of the waterworks
 - waterworks reserves





Every household needs an emergency plan. It will help you and your family know what to do in case there is an emergency. Your family may not be together when an emergency occurs, and a meeting place is a good idea to have in place. Having emergency kits that include a first aid kit, flashlights, batteries, candles with wooden matches or lighters, cash, small tools and sewing kit, radio with batteries, and blankets. You should also have non perishable food, bottled water, pots and a can opener in a safe, and easily accessible area. Having duct tape, tarps, paper towel/toilet paper, small propane or gas cooking area, utensils and hand sanitizer is also important. Have a medication bag including Tylenol/Advil, Benadryl and If anybody in the family is on a daily prescription, keep a week's worth of it as well. You can change out every time you have a refill. If you have pets, you should keep food and water for them as well. Make copies of ALL important documents such as health cards, birth and marriage certificates, land and insurance documents and banking information. If you have small children, some toys and books to keep their minds off what may be a scary situation.

In your vehicles you should also have an emergency first aid kit along with sand, tow rope and jumper cables, shovel, fire extinguisher, blankets and water.

Lots of cell phones now have the option to create reminders. Set a reminder for every year to replace anything that needs replacing in your first aid kit, the batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and change out your non-perishable foods.
