DID YOU KNOW...

Balgonie receives its water from the Pilot Butte Water Treatment Plant. As the water is treated with Reverse Osmosis, it is quite soft. Our current water hardness is .53grains/gallon. Many residents have chosen to remove their water softeners as they are no longer necessary.

Salt from softeners is washed into our town's wastewater through normal activities like showers, using the toilet and washing clothes. Your softened water ends up in our town's wastewater lagoon which is used to irrigate agricultural land. The longer an area is watered with salt-treated water, the more the soil in that area gets compacted and loses vital nutrients. Over time the high salt concentration will not only kill existing plants but also prevents new plants from growing in the poisoned soil. We can prevent salt from building up in the wastewater by reducing or eliminating softener salts.

We hope everyone had a safe and festive holiday season! Let's make 2018 another great year.

The outdoor arena will be in full swing if the temperature drops. Just a reminder to all users - there are snow shovels provided for clearing the ice surface. Please put scrapers back when you are finished with them. The Zamboni will flood the ice once a week. There is no set day for this. The lights will turn on around 5:30 p.m. and turn off at 9:30 p.m.



If the weather is above zero for a few days, please refrain from using the arena so we do not damage the ice. Please be courteous to others who are also using the facility.



REMINDER:

Garbage and Recycling Carts are to be put out on the street on or BEFORE 7am, and brought in after garbage or recycling collection is complete. If carts are damaged before or after these hours, homeowners are responsible for the charges. As we are not the only town with these services, there is no specific time other than by 7:00a.m. to be prepared for pick-up. If you miss pick-up because your container is NOT at the curb on time, it will be the owner's responsibility to dispose of the contents if required.

Loraas Bins

There will be Loraas bins available at the transfer station on the 1st and 3rd Friday of every month for town residents only. Our transfer station is equipped with security cameras, as well as a card reader. Fines have been laid for illegal dumping, and will continue to be laid to any person who violates these rules.

The TRANSFER STATION is electronically set up to provide our town residents with accessibility day or night. The Town of Balgonie offers these services on site at the TRANSFER STATION, but has the added responsibility to ensure that environmental regulations are followed. Municipalities can be fined for burning unapproved items and not disposing of things in the manner set forth by the Provincial Ministry of Environment and the Provincial Clean Air Act.

Recently, items have been left at the TRANSFER STATION which are not permitted. Please ensure that you read and understand what items are allowed and not allowed to be left at the TRANSFER STATION. Individuals who leave items which are not allowed will be required to clean up the improper disposal, and/or pay charges for the Town to remove the items. There is also a \$500 penalty for illegal dumping at the site. The transfer station cards can be cancelled at the discretion of the Council of the Town of Balgonie.

THE TRANSFER STATION IS NOT A GARBAGE DUMP!

The Transfer Station is a location where the following items can be left: Scrap Metal, Tree Branches and Grass Clippings (removed from the plastic bags) Compostable materials, Oil and Containers - There is an oil recycling center station where you are able to dump unused oils and their containers on the south side of the station.

The 1st & 3rd Friday of every month, a Loraas bin is delivered to the transfer station. This is for town residents to use for the items which are too large for the household carts. Please note, this is only to be used by Balgonie residents. Larger loads due to fence removal, renovation etc, should be taken to the Regina landfill.

If the bin is full or not at the site, do not leave items, take them to the Regina landfill.

Key cards, which are lost, should be reported to the Town Office. They will be removed from the computer system and a new card will be issued at a cost to you of \$25.00. If you are moving, please return the key card to the Town Office. Diabetes also have clothing bins to take donations.

Reminder to Balgonie Residents:

Vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than 24 hours, except weekends and holidays. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property.

All vehicles stored on your property must be licensed and in good repair. Storage of unlicensed and junked vehicles on your property are considered to be a "nuisance" by Town of Balgonie Bylaws.

Please contact the Town office to obtain your account numbers.

Electronic payments for utilities and taxes are a convenient way to pay your bills, but they are not instantaneous. Please allow **2-3 business days** before any due date so that your payment is receipted by our office before any penalties apply. The bank requires time to process the payment and advise the Town.







The RM of Edenwold maintenance team is committed to fighting noxious weeds within the RM. Leafy spurge, wild parsnip and common burdock (which looks like rhubarb but grows tall) can inhibit surface drainage and choke out native plants and vegetation. A tip to homeowners: wild bird seed and packages of wild flower seed can contain seed for these weeds. For more information about noxious weeds within the RM, and opportunities for landowners to protect their property, contact the RM office at 306-771-2522

DID YOU KNOW?...

The RM of Edenwold hires summer students each summer through the WUQWATER program. Those students in turn map areas of the RM that have an identified noxious weed issue and when those areas were treated.


