





Overland Flood Insurance in Saskatchewan

Insurance providers in Saskatchewan have recently started to offer policies that protect homeowners from overland flooding. The Government of Saskatchewan advises all property owners to obtain adequate coverage for their property.



Will flood insurance provide better coverage than PDAP?

- PDAP provides assistance for uninsurable losses of essential goods to help people get back to predisaster condition, with specific limits on the amount of maximum assistance that can be provided. In general, overland flood insurance will allow people to choose the amount of coverage and the deductible level that best meets their needs. Homeowners are encouraged to speak to their insurance broker or insurance company.
- Will PDAP still provide assistance if I don't get flood insurance?
- Eligible claims under PDAP depend on the availability and affordability of insurance in the Saskatchewan marketplace. At this point, overland flood insurance has not been deemed reasonably available in Saskatchewan.

Until it is determined to be reasonably available, applicants who have not purchased overland flood insurance will remain eligible for financial assistance under current PDAP regulations (even if a product was offered and declined). Applicants who have made the decision to purchase private flood insurance may not be considered eligible for financial assistance under PDAP for this type of loss, as per current regulations.

Once it is determined that flood insurance is reasonably available, some claims may no longer be eligible for PDAP assistance. Reasonable availability will be determined by PDAP. Homeowners are encouraged to speak to their insurance broker or insurance company.

What will PDAP pay for flood damage?

PDAP's guidelines have always been consistent in that the program is not intended to compete with private insurers nor does it provide full compensation. PDAP provides assistance for uninsurable losses of essential goods to help people get back to pre-disaster condition, with specific limits on the amount of maximum assistance that can be provided.

- If my property is located in a lower/higher-risk area, do I need to obtain insurance?
- All homeowners should review their options for flood insurance with their insurance broker or insurance company to ensure they are getting adequate coverage for their properties, if it is available and at a reasonable cost. Reasonable cost varies by location of the property and level of risk.
- Will PDAP cover my flood insurance deductible?
- No, PDAP does not cover insurance deductibles.
- Will PDAP top up my flood insurance amount?
- No, PDAP cannot top up on any insurance coverage. However, until flood insurance is considered to be reasonably available in Saskatchewan, PDAP assistance will be considered in situations where eligible claimants can demonstrate that they are worse off as a result of purchasing flood insurance than if they had made a claim through PDAP. This could occur where an insurance company caps the total loss payable for a homeowner, perhaps because their home is in an area at a higher risk of flooding. By ensuring that homeowners are no worse off, this will avoid the perception that early adopters that chose to purchase insurance are being penalized for their choice.
- What if I can't get flood insurance?
- Homeowners are strongly encouraged to check with their insurance broker and/or all insurance providers. As overland flooding insurance is new to Saskatchewan, not all insurance companies have announced implementation at this time.

REMINDER:

Garbage and Recycling Carts are to be put out on the street on or BEFORE 7am, and brought in after garbage or recycling collection is complete. If carts are damaged before or after these hours, homeowners are responsible for the charges. As we are not the only town with these services, there is no specific time other than by 7:00a.m. to be prepared for pick-up. If you miss pick-up because your container is NOT at the curb on time, it will be the owner's responsibility to dispose of the contents if required.

Loraas Bins

There will be Loraas bins available at the transfer station on the 1st and 3rd Friday of every month for town residents only. Our transfer station is equipped with security cameras, as well as a card reader. Fines have been laid for illegal dumping, and will continue to be laid to any person who violates these rules.

The TRANSFER STATION is electronically set up to provide our town residents with accessibility day or night. The Town of Balgonie offers these services on site at the TRANSFER STATION, but has the added responsibility to ensure that environmental regulations are followed. Municipalities can be fined for burning unapproved items and not disposing of things in the manner set forth by the Provincial Ministry of Environment and the Provincial Clean Air Act.

Recently, items have been left at the TRANSFER STATION which are not permitted. Please ensure that you read and understand what items are allowed and not allowed to be left at the TRANSFER STATION. Individuals who leave items which are not allowed will be required to clean up the improper disposal, and/or pay charges for the Town to remove the items. There is also a \$500 penalty for illegal dumping at the site. The transfer station cards can be cancelled at the discretion of the Council of the Town of Balgonie.

THE TRANSFER STATION IS NOT A GARBAGE DUMP!

The Transfer Station is a location where the following items can be left: Scrap Metal, Tree Branches and Grass Clippings (removed from the plastic bags) Compostable materials, Oil and Containers - There is an oil recycling center station where you are able to dump unused oils and their containers on the south side of the station.

The 1st & 3rd Friday of every month, a Loraas bin is delivered to the transfer station. This is for town residents to use for the items which are too large for the household carts. Please note, this is only to be used by Balgonie residents. Larger loads due to fence removal, renovation etc, should be taken to the Regina landfill.

If the bin is full or not at the site, do not leave items, take them to the Regina landfill.

Key cards, which are lost, should be reported to the Town Office. They will be removed from the computer system and a new card will be issued at a cost to you of \$25.00. If you are moving, please return the key card to the Town Office. Diabetes also have clothing bins to take donations.

The successful bidder will adhere to the Town's current bottling company. The Town of Balgonie will make necessary repairs to equipment provided and as identified by the Canteen operator. Canteen operator is to ensure that all health and safety regulations are followed. Utility expenses will be paid for by the Town of Balgonie. Hours of canteen operation will be based on facility usage.

The bids will be opened and the successful bid will be selected by Town Council at their regular public meeting on March 12, 2018. Bidders are encouraged to supply information regarding their experience in food service delivery and provide proof of food handling course. Bids should include the proposed monthly fee to be paid to the Town of Balgonie for use of the arena's fully equipped canteen facility.

The highest bid will not necessarily be the accepted offer.

Fire protection agreements signed

The RM of Edenwold has entered into fire protection agreements with the towns of Pilot Butte, Balgonie, White City and the villages of Kronau and Edenwold.

"The cost of fire protection for the municipality is on the rise," says RM of Edenwold Reeve Mitchell Huber. "Costs

increase over time and we are looking at all options. We assure our ratepayers we're working hard to keep costs in check while paying for the volunteer services."

The RM has cost-shared several pieces of equipment including: 2013 - \$32,000 to retro fit a grass fire rapid response truck for Balgonie



2016 - \$19,800 (38% of the cost) of regional-use ladder truck housed in White City

EDENWOLD

2016 - \$56,173 (65% of the cost) of new water tanker fire truck for White City

2017 - \$120,000 (50% of the cost) of new rapid response fire truck with Pilot Butte

RM of

2018 - \$75,000 is budgeted for a new water tanker truck for Pilot Butte.

These signed 2018 fire agreements are a continuation of agreements that have been in place for several years. The agreement with Kronau is a new agreement. "We are proud of the dedication and service provided by the area volunteer fire departments," says Huber. "We thank each and every member of the fire departments for their service and their commitment to community."







ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS:


