Any person who wishes to appeal against his or her assessment is required to file his or her notice of appeal accompanied by a \$75.00 fee for each assessment being appealed, which will be returned if the appeal is successful with:

QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED REGARDING APPEALING YOUR PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

(The following questions and answers are taken from the pamphlet "Understanding the Property Assessment Appeal Process" from the Saskatchewan Government Relations, Provincial Municipal Relations and Advisory Services)

What is Property Assessment?

Property assessment is the process of determining a property's assessed value as of a specific date for property tax purposes. The assessment provides an estimate of the property's value that reflects typical market conditions.

Local governments use property assessments as a basis for the distribution of property taxes among property owners. **Property assessment is not the same as property tax.** The assessment of a property is the value assigned to it as the basis for allocating taxes among various classes of property.

Who Can I Contact to Explain My Assessment?

You should start with your Administrator of your Municipality (Phone 306-771-2284). You can also call SAMA (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) (Phone 306-527-8395) as it is the agency that performs Balgonie's assessments; however, there may be a charge for this service.

Preparing the Notice of Appeal Form

When making an assessment appeal, the notice of appeal form must be fully completed. You must provide specific grounds supporting the appeal. You are required to provide as many details as possible and all facts and evidence that an error has been made in the:

- valuation of the property;
- classification of the property;
- preparation of the relevant assessment roll or assessment notice; and/or
- content of the relevant assessment roll or assessment notice.

The grounds for the appeal must be detailed. Phrases such as "assessment too high" or "assessment too low" are **NOT** sufficient.

It is your responsibility to make a case to the Board of Revision. It may be as simple as proving that dimensions or measurements are wrong or that a classification is not correct, or as complex as proving that the value of a property is not fairly assessed compared to another property that is similar in nature.

Regular Assessment Appeals or Simplified Assessment Appeals?

When making regular or simplified assessment appeals, the notice of appeal form must be fully completed. Regular appeal — the appellant must provide specific written grounds supporting the appeal when submitting it to the secretary before the hearing. Simplified appeal — the appellant is not required to submit detailed written grounds to the secretary before the hearing but must have detailed information ready to present to the appeal board.

Can I Base My Appeal on the Fact that I Feel my <u>Taxes</u> are Too High?


NO! Legislation outlines the valid grounds of appeal. Only your property assessment can be appealed, not taxes or mill rates.

The Assessment Process and Its Relation to Taxes

SAMA's role in determining assessed value for properties is just the first part of a process established by provincial legislation. The second part is the application of provincial government established tax policy, such as property classes, percentage of value, and statutory exemptions. The third and final part of the process involves a provincial education mill rate factor, and the local mill rate factor which is determined annually by the local municipalities based on local budget needs. They then multiply the taxable assessment by these mill rates to determine your property tax bill.



In addition to determining mill rates, local governments have the authority to apply a series of tax tools, such as mill rate factors by local property class, minimum tax, and base tax. Cities also have the ability to create additional tax subclasses to apply mill rate factors. As well, cities can phase-in tax changes due to a revaluation. These tax tools further impact the specific tax bill received by a taxpayer.

More information about assessment and its relation to taxation can be found by visiting the Ministry of Government Relations' web site.

To calculate the property tax, the authority—in this case the Town of Balgonie—multiplies the taxable assessed value by the mill rate and then divides by 1,000. The base tax is then added to that amount and then the same calculation for the school division is added to that.

The Town is ONLY the collector of the school taxes for the division. The Town does not set their mill rate, but we are told by the Provincial Government what the school rate will be set at.

A message from the RM of Edenwold

New office in Emerald Park

Council approved the build of a new office for the RM of Edenwold. Construction is to begin in spring 2018. As the municipality continues to grow, so does the need for more office space. "We addressed the public works department's need for a bigger building in



the past couple of years. Now it is time to deal with our office space. The larger office will better accommodate council meetings, staff and our ratepayers; especially larger delegations that attend our public hearings," explains Kim McIvor, Chief Administrative Officer with the RM. The current office location in Balgonie is co-owned by the RM and the town. The RM will sell their portion of the building to the town and use those proceeds towards the construction of the new 7,200 square foot facility in Emerald Park at a cost of 1.32 million. The new office is scheduled to open in November of 2018 at the corner of South Plains Road and Hutchence Road in Emerald Park. "Relocating to our high density residential and commercial area shows a commitment now and into the future. We plan on continuing to grow our municipality in a well-planned, community oriented manner that promotes active lifestyles and use of our outdoor space," explains Senior Planner with the RM, Jana Jedlic. The greenspace at the new office will connect to the 11 kilometres of walking paths in Emerald Park.

"There will be no increase to taxes for our ratepayers for the new office," assures RM Reeve Mitchell Huber. "Council has been putting money away in reserves for a number of years now and this project will be funded by this reserve money."

Snowmobile safety

As the snow beckons, snowmobile enthusiasts will be enticed to fire up their sleds and head out. "We ask that anyone using their sleds in the RM be respectful," says Rod Ash, Community Safety Officer with the RM of Edenwold. "If you have questions about where you can and can not use your snowmobile, please check online or call the RM office." While the RM does not have a specific bylaw for snowmobiles, the laws are set by the province under *The Snowmobile Act* and the *Traffic Safety Act*. Resources for snowmobilers:

Provincial budget and RM 2018 budget

The RM of Edenwold council is working out budget details for the 2018 fiscal year. "2017 was an exciting budget year but also had its challenges with the new assessment valuations, and trying to keep a good balance of taxation percentages between the property classes within our municipality," says Kim McIvor, CAO with the RM. "We are thankful for the provincial government revenue sharing having increased by 197% from 2007-08 to 2017-18." For the past 10 years, provincial government revenue sharing has been based on a percentage of PST. "This has greatly enhanced our revenue sharing ability and stability," explains McIvor, "which in turn enables council to put tax dollars back into infrastructure. Council does a great job using tax dollars wisely and is proud of the sound fiscal management practices that ensure we stay viable as a rural municipality."




ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS:



AUCTION

- All Goalies are auctioned as a team package (essentially you are picking that team's goaltending points).
- Once a team has zero points remaining or chooses a player from the pick list they must turn in their team's bidding card.
- Trading players, points or draft position (pending draft order rules) is not allowed.
- The Auctioneer's decision is final on any bidding disputes.
- The auction player list and pick list will be provided at the draft.

SCORING

- Player scoring 1 point / goal 1 point / assist
- Goalie scoring 1 point / win 2 points / shutout 1 point / goal -1 point / assist

DRAFT ORDER

- The draft order is determined by the NHL's scoring race (points) - descending in order beginning with the highest scorer. The draft order may be subject to change.

PICK LIST

- The pick list is a pre-determined list of players that are projected to finish at the lower end of their team's scoring.
- Each team will have between 5 and 10 players on this list.
- Pick list player = 10 points

- Players from the pick list must be chosen before the final player is auctioned.







REMINDER:

Garbage and Recycling Carts are to be put out on the street on or BEFORE 7am, and brought in after garbage or recycling collection is complete. If carts are damaged before or after these hours, *homeowners* are responsible for the charges. As we are not the only town with these services, there is no specific time other than by 7:00a.m. to be prepared for pick-up. If you miss pick-up because your container is NOT at the curb on time, it will be the owner's responsibility to dispose of the contents if required.

Loraas Bins

There will be Loraas bins available at the transfer station on the 1st and 3rd Friday of every month for town residents only. Our transfer station is equipped with security cameras, as well as a card reader. Fines have been laid for illegal dumping, and will continue to be laid to any person who violates these rules.

The TRANSFER STATION is electronically set up to provide our town residents with accessibility day or night. The Town of Balgonie offers these services on site at the TRANSFER STATION, but has the added responsibility to ensure that environmental regulations are followed. Municipalities can be fined for burning unapproved items and not disposing of things in the manner set forth by the Provincial Ministry of Environment and the Provincial Clean Air Act.

Recently, items have been left at the TRANSFER STATION which are not permitted. Please ensure that you read and understand what items are allowed and not allowed to be left at the TRANSFER STATION. Individuals who leave items which are not allowed will be required to clean up the improper disposal, and/or pay charges for the Town to remove the items. There is also a \$500 penalty for illegal dumping at the site. The transfer station cards can be cancelled at the discretion of the Council of the Town of Balgonie.

THE TRANSFER STATION IS NOT A GARBAGE DUMP!

The Transfer Station is a location where the following items can be left: Scrap Metal, Tree Branches and Grass Clippings (removed from the plastic bags) Compostable materials, Oil and Containers - There is an oil recycling center station where you are able to dump unused oils and their containers on the south side of the station.

The 1st & 3rd Friday of every month, a Loraas bin is delivered to the transfer station. This is for town residents to use for the items which are too large for the household carts. Please note, this is only to be used by Balgonie residents. Larger loads due to fence removal, renovation etc, should be taken to the Regina landfill.

If the bin is full or not at the site, do not leave items, take them to the Regina landfill.

Key cards, which are lost, should be reported to the Town Office. They will be removed from the computer system and a new card will be issued at a cost to you of \$25.00. If you are moving, please return the key card to the Town Office. Diabetes also have clothing bins to take donations.
