Our transfer station is equipped with security cameras, as well as a card reader. Fines have been laid for illegal dumping, and will continue to be laid to any person who violates these rules. TRANSFER STATION

The TRANSFER STATION is electronically set up to provide our town residents with accessibility day or night. The Town of Balgonie offers these services on site at the TRANSFER STATION, but has the added responsibility to ensure that environmental regulations are followed. Municipalities can be fined for burning unapproved items and not disposing of things in the manner set forth by the Provincial Ministry of Environment and the Provincial Clean Air Act.

Recently, items have been left at the TRANSFER STATION which are not permitted. Please ensure that you read and understand what items are allowed and not allowed to be left at the TRANSFER STATION. Individuals who leave items which are not allowed will be required to clean up the improper disposal, and/or pay charges for the Town to remove the items. There is also a \$500 penalty for illegal dumping at the site. The transfer station cards can be cancelled at the discretion of the Council of the Town of Balgonie. THE TRANSFER STATION IS NOT A GARBAGE DUMP!

The Transfer Station is a location where the following items can be left:

Scrap Metal

Tree Branches and Grass Clippings (removed from the plastic bags)

Compostable materials

Oil and Containers - There is an oil recycling centre station where you are able to dump unused oils and their containers on the south side of the station.

The 1st & 3rd Friday of every month, a Loraas bin is delivered to the transfer station. This is for town residents to use for the items which are too large for the household carts. Please note, this is only to be used by Balgonie residents. Larger loads due to fence removal, renovation etc, should be taken to the Regina landfill.

If the bin is full or not at the site, do not leave items, take them to the Regina landfill.

Key cards, which are lost, should be reported to the Town Office. They will be removed from the computer system and a new card will be issued at a cost to you of \$25.00. If you are moving, please return the key card to the Town Office. Diabetes also have clothing bins to take donations.

A huge thank you to our Community Safety Officers, S/Cst. Ferris, S/Cst. Ash and S/Cst. Roteliuk. The Town has contracted the CSO's through the R.M. of

Edenwold, to enforce town bylaws and provincial statutes. Tickets have been laid for excessive speed, noise, and other driving violations, as well as over weight charges. They have been hard at work making Balgonie a safer place for all. Watch for them in their white truck in the below picture. If you see the flashing lights, you MUST stop.

Concerns were shared about bylaw infractions. They are Community Safety Officers (CSO) were hired to address these issues, as well as enforce them. Often, town staff is contacted about various bylaw infractions such as noisy dogs, animals running at large, parking & driving issues, and/or over weight trucks. With available CSO manpower, these complaints can be handled in a timely manner and inhibit repeat offenses. Community Safety Officers should not be **confused with the RCMP Officers. RCMP officers have a broader range of responsibilities. The CSO's and White Butte** RCMP are working on an agreement, Memorandum of Understanding, that will not only compliment but also enhance the public safety of our town. Beyond enforcement, the Community Safety Officers want to foster and promote a safer community. The Community Safety Officers will be our patrolling the town, working various shifts. Look for them in uniform, driving a clearly marked vehicle. REMEMBER: if you are experiencing a medical emergency, an assault or any other serious crime, please call 9-1-1 or the White Butte RCMP detachment at 306-781-5050.



What is the speed limit of where you are driving?

On Balgonie streets, the speed limit is 40km/hr., unless you are in the <u>school zone</u> which is marked at 30km/hr. The signs are located at the corners of Main St. & Assiniboia St. and also Main St. & Qu'Appelle St.

We have had a speed reduction on the entire Westview gravel road where the speed limit is now 50km/hr. This road is for local traffic only, and restricted to 10 tonne gross weight.

Please be aware that the Highway #1 speed limit has been reduced to 60km/hr. for the construction of the bypass project. As well as on Highway 46, there is a speed reduction around Pilot Butte from 100Km/hour to 80km/hr.

Now that students are back in school, there has been an increase of vehicles driving inappropriately throughout town, especially over the noon hour. Please make sure to remind all drivers in your household, that driving is a privilege not a right. Officers will be issuing ticket to those who are in violation of these limits, as well as any other violations.

Help make Balgonie a Safer Place:

If you observe poor community driving choices, please call the RCMP and report the incident to them. White Butte Detachment 306-781-5050.

If you suspect that the driver is a student at Greenall High School, please call the school at 306-771-2566, and provide the details of the report to the office so they can look into the situation at the school level. Once you have contacted the school and shared this information, please call the RCMP and report the incident to them.

Please report as many of the following details as you have available:

Name/description of the driver.

Vehicle description, make, model, color, license plate.

Date and time of incident.

A description of the incident, including location. Failing to stop at a stop sign, driving without care and attention, texting or using cellphones, stunting (doing donuts), speeding, etc. There are many young children coming and going to school throughout the day, and either on foot or their bikes. They are not always paying attention, so please keep your eyes open and open the traffic laws in place.







A message from the RM of Edenwold

Great Plains Road walkway announced

Ratepayers and business owners requested a safer way for pedestrians to navigate a walk along Great Plains Road and the intersection of Great Plains Road and Emerald Park Road. The RM of Edenwold planning staff, working with RBDB and the Ministry of Highways, has come up with a plan

for a walkway that will be built in phases from Tim Hortons in Emerald Park through to the Emerald Park Soccer Fields. Three raised pedestrian crossings will be included near Communiskate and in front of and behind the RCMP detachment. Road and paving projects update

As the weather turns, road maintenance and construction projects are wrapping up for 2017. This year the RM of Edenwold as able to complete the clay capping of seven miles of Grid Road 734, the paving of Bardel Crescent at Crawford Developments, the paving of Butte Road from the Hwy #1 North Service Road past Spruce Creek Estates along with the paving of the internal streets in Carson Business Park. The treatment plant is scheduled to be operational by the summer of 2018. In April 2017 the WCRM158 Wastewater Authority entered into agreements with the federal and provincial governments to fund the new wastewater treatment facilities and associated works, totalling \$21,900,000. The first phase of the project includes a new wastewater treatment plant designed to serve 15,000 people.
