This time consuming job is made a lot easier when vehicles are moved off the streets for the graders to come through. As well, the Town Boulevard areas (the first 12-15 feet of each property) where the snow is placed, need to be free of vehicles and trailers.

## Statement from the Council of the Town of Balgonie:

The Town of Balgonie has met with members of the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure on multiple occasions to discuss their decision on the closure of Main Street and its impact on our town. The closure has been a great loss to the vitality of our Town and has created emergency response considerations as well as impacting traffic patterns within our community.

The Ministry and its engineers are unwavering in their view that the intersection, including "Right In/Right Out" at Main Street, must close. The rationale given by the Ministry is that there is not enough room between Highway 10 and Main Street and between Main Street and Highway 46 to design a safe access. The distances between the bypass and the Highway 10 overpass have made it impossible, by today's engineering standards, to accommodate this access point.

The Ministry engaged an outside engineer to review any possibility of retaining a "Right In/Right Out" at Main Street in Balgonie. The engineer also reviewed the options presented by Council at the September 25<sup>th</sup> meeting with the Ministry of Highways. His review concluded the same results that were presented to the Town by the Ministry of Highways. There was no safe way to keep the access from Highway 1 at Main Street.

While this closure is a great loss to our community, the Town and the Ministry have discussed work which will be done to address the impact on traffic operations and emergency responses. Both the parties have agreed to a gated access for emergency vehicles and evacuation. The safety of the Town residents and the response times for our emergency personnel is paramount. The work on the gated access will begin very soon. Additionally, the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure has agreed to provide the Town with certain improvements to our roads, lighting and traffic controls within our Town. This will be important as the Town is impacted by the closure and these measures will assist the municipality in responding to these challenges.

The Town Council would like to acknowledge the efforts of, and thank the local community residents and the "Save our Main Street" group for their determination in having the issues of Balgonie heard. Progress has been made in the discussions with the Ministry of Highways---this progress would not have been possible without the community voicing concerns. The Town and the Ministry are working towards a Memorandum of Understanding which will outline the details of the negotiations.

# A message from the RM of Edenwold

### Business survey results announced

Over the summer months, the RM of Edenwold engaged business owners and their employees through a business survey. Over 700 hard copies of the survey were distributed and 119 responses were collected -- a 17 per cent response rate. Responses were received from businesses north



of Highway 1 and Emerald Park, including Great Plains Industrial Park. The questions focused on housing and transportation. Seventy-eight per cent of respondents surveyed commute from outside the Emerald Park area. Some findings:

- About 20 per cent of people said they would participate in an employee shuttle and 45.5 per cent said they liked the idea and would consider using it if it was available.
- · Thirty-five per cent of respondents rent while 65 per cent own their homes.
- The most popular form of housing is the single-family dwelling. However, 20 per cent of respondents live in a multi-unit dwelling (apartment or condo).
- Of the respondents who completed the survey, 31 per cent said they would like to live in Emerald Park
  and an additional 28 per cent said they may like to live in the area. The majority of survey respondents
  identified affordable housing as an important issue for the RM to focus on in the coming years.

Emerald Park IGA gift card prizes were offered as incentives to fill out the survey. Gift card winners were Ashley Greiner of Emerald Park Childcare and Jackie Weisgarber of Reed Leisure Products.

### Emerald Park Soccer Centre Construction update

Pending some material delivery, the Emerald Park Soccer Centre - scheduled to be completed for mid-October - will now be completed in November. The RM of Edenwold plans on hosting a grand opening event to recognize the community groups and sponsors who helped make this community asset a reality.

### **Update on Canada Post**

For some time, the RM of Edenwold staff have been communicating with Canada Post regarding the creation of a post office in Emerald Park for residents.

"The addition of a post office in the community will be welcomed by current residents and businesses... Further, it will act as a place-making feature for the community...Considering Emerald Park already has its own postal code, Council feels that the addition of a post office is the next logical step for Canada Post to pursue," Jana Jedlic, Senior Municipal Planner with the RM of Edenwold, wrote - in part - in a letter to the Crown corporation.

In October, RM staff received a note back from Canada Post which stated: "Our findings indicate that the addition of a post office in Emerald City would not be viable. We believe the current services provided through community mail boxes and the White City post office are suitable and meet the needs of the community." "We are disappointed," Jedlic says. "Staff and council will talk about next steps and we would love to hear from our ratepayers and business owners about how they feel about this issue."






