Carbon Monoxide & Smoke Alarms New Law Effective July 1, 2022

As per the Government of Saskatchewan's Building Code Regulations, it is law that Saskatchewan residents have carbon monoxide and smoke alarms installed in every residential home before July 1, 2022.

Enforcement will not begin until July 1, 2022, so you can have time to research, purchase and install these alarms in your residence.

What fruits can be grown, special challenges to consider when choosing what to plant, care of fruit crops, recommended varieties

Dr. Bob Bors



University of Saskatchewan Fruit Program Home Page

Dr. Bob Bors is a Professor at the U of S where he teaches classes on Fruit Science, Plant Propagation, Greenhouse Management and Introduction to Horticulture. His research involves breeding hardy fruits for northern areas. His program has 40 acres of fruit and a 93-year history of developing varieties for Northern Canada and is the coldest location in North America for a major fruit breeding program. In recent years his program has released 5 sour cherries, 4 apples and 8 Haskap varieties.

BES KINDERGARTEN FAQ'S

1) How many students in the Kindergarten classrooms?

This year we have two kindergarten classrooms, 23 and 24 students. Two teachers and one Educational Assistant make up our K-Team.

2) Full Days or 1/2 Days?

Our Kindergartners attend full days, alternating days on a six day cycle. We send the Kindergarten calendar out in June to help you schedule child care requirements.

3) Are there other professionals who support Kindergartners?

Besides the classroom teacher, and Educational Assistants (dependent on student needs), students are supported by a Speech Language Pathologist, a Psychologist and an Occupational Therapist as necessary.

4) How do I know if my child is ready for Kindergarten?

By helping your child be curious and independent, they will be ready for Kindergarten. If you have more questions, please contact Mrs. Moroz (andrea.moroz@pvsd.ca) about Kindergarten readiness screening questions. Remember, Play Based Learning is Kindergarten!






RDIEC TRY-A-CAREER

Get to Know Our Teachers - Miss. Sammy


- Where did you take your dance lessons growing up? When I was a student of dance, I trained at Dance Sensations by Desire in Pilot Butte!



Compost Pickup

Loraas Disposal will pick up compost bins every Monday until November.

Please have all bins out on your front curb before 7:00 a.m. to ensure pickup.



- TRANSFER STATION -

The Transfer Station is electronically set up and monitored to provide our Town residents with accessibility day and night. The Town of Balgonie offers on site services at the Transfer Station, but has the added responsibility to ensure that environmental regulations are followed. Municipalities can be fined for burning unapproved items and not properly disposing of items set forth by the Ministry of Environment and the Clean Air Act.

The red Loraas Disposal bin is delivered on the first (1st) and third (3rd) Friday of every month. There is no specific time as to when the bin will arrive on these days. IF A RED BIN IS UNAVAILABLE, DO NOT LEAVE ANY ITEMS WHERE THE BIN IS NORMALLY LOCATED. Individuals who leave items which are not permitted will be fined up to \$500.00, and will have their Transfer Station card suspended. The card holder will be held accountable for all occurrences at the Transfer Station whether they accessed the Transfer Station themselves or provided their card to another individual.

Be courteous of others! Although a bin may be available, large items and multiple loads take up the entirety of the bin, making it unusable for other residents. If you have multiple large items, please take them to the Regina Landfill. Home builders/developers are not permitted to use the red Loraas Disposal bin and are required to rent their own waste container bins.

Items that may be left at the Transfer Station in their designated areas:

- Scrap metal
 - Propane tanks are accepted in the scrap metal pile.
 - Please remove the freon from fridges and freezers.
- Tree branches
 - Absolutely NO treated or painted wood.
- Compostable materials
 - Bags or boxes containing compostable materials are NOT to be left in the compost area.
- Oil recycling station
- Cement

Items that may not be left at the Transfer Station/in the red Loraas Disposal bin:

- Tires
- Shingles

Items you are encouraged to recycle at SARCAN:

- Beverage Containers
- Batteries
- Flectronics
- Household Paint
- Non-Beverage Glass Containers (only accepted at Regina and Saskatoon SARCAN locations)

TRANSFER STATION KEY CARDS

Key cards are provided to newly built homes that are occupied, and new residents, at no charge. However, if a key card is lost, it should be reported to the Town Office immediately to be disabled. The card(s) will be removed from the system and a new card, if requested, will be provided at a cost of \$40.00.

IF YOU ARE MOVING - we request the transfer station card to be brought in to the Town Office so we can provide it to the new homeowners. Thank you.
