Utility Bills Due

Utility bills that were sent out in October are due November 12, 2024. If you did not receive your bill, please call the Town Office at 306-771-2284. A reminder that utility bills are due, in full, 30 days after the notice is sent out.

Back Alleys

To help with upcoming snow removal in back alleys, please ensure all campers, bins, or anything else large or in the way is moved by November 1st. Thank you in advance!

Paying Tax & Utility Bills Online

Utility and tax bills may be paid through your online banking service. Please use **Balgonie (Town of) Taxes** for your taxes and **Balgonie (Town of) Utilities** for your water/sewer bills. If you are unsure of your account number, please contact the Town Office to obtain your account number.



When making an online payment, allow 2-3 business days before any due date so that your payment is received prior to any penalties being applied to your account.

Reminder to Pet Owners

To be a Responsible Pet Owner, follow these 4 easy steps!

- Step 1.** Walk your pet on a leash.
- Step 2.** Pick up after your pet. There are multiple garbage cans located throughout the town for you to use.
- Step 3.** Spay/Neuter your pet.
- Step 4.** License your pet at the Town Office.

Storage of Vehicles

All vehicles stored on your property must be licensed and in good repair. Storage of unlicensed and junked vehicles on your property are considered a “nuisance” by Town of Balgonie bylaws.



Plastiq Payments

How to pay with Plastiq:

1. Go to www.townofbalgonie.ca
2. Scroll down to the right hand side of the screen.
3. Sign up - create a free account, add who you are paying, and enter your card info.
4. Plastiq will process your payment and the funds will be transferred to the Town of Balgonie.

Fees associated with Plastiq are as follows:

- Standard credit card rate of 2.9%
- Debit cards are discounted to 1%

Boulevard Reminders

Whether we like it or not, the snow will soon be here! We would like to kindly remind residents that the Town boulevard portion at the front of each property is approximately 12-20 feet (with exception of the bays). Although our residents care for the boulevards, it is the Town's property and therefore that is where snow is placed.

Soft landscaping, such as sprinklers, rocks, gardens, etc. are placed on the boulevard at your own risk. Thank you for your understanding.



Fall Storage Reminders

With winter soon upon us, please make sure that all campers, trailers, recreation vehicles, basketball nets, etc. are properly stored off the street for the upcoming season. Please make necessary arrangements needed to ensure that they are not on town property.

RV storage is not permitted in the front yard from November 1st to April 1st of each year.

Vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than 24 hours except on weekends and holidays. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property.

 - Has resided in the municipality (Town of Balgonie) for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election; or
 - Is the owner of accessible land situated in the municipality for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

When you come to vote, you will be asked to:

- Complete a Voter's Registration form declaring that you are eligible to vote
- Show identification;
 - Government issued photo ID that shows your name and address or;
 - Two forms of identification showing your name (one of which must have your address).

Wagman, Janet A.







I have always felt that the education crisis and healthcare crisis run parallel.

Teachers and nurses have a lot in common: we are expected to do more with less. I have and do sit on a number of active committees in that sector as I have always been a strong advocate for nurses, including the Nursing Advisory Committee, the OH&S committee, a SUN delegate for the Saskatchewan Federation of Labour, and I also am a board member of the Association of Professional Nurses of Saskatchewan (APNS). I am no stranger to boards or committees.

I am a very active member of my union and, as such, I am knowledgeable about collective bargaining. I understand the power of strong collective bargaining language and a strong union willing to fight for its members.

I hear and feel first hand the cries for help. Both sectors are in a crisis.

Now that I have young children in the school system full time (one that just started grade 1 and another in Grade 4), I have decided that, while I still will continue to fight for nurses, I need to move my focus to my children and their future in the education system. As we know, education is at the heart of every community. Good education leads to overall better health outcomes. The two run parallel. We need a symbiotic relationship.

Unfortunately, I have had very poor first hand experience with some serious issues in our school division. We have felt dismissed and unheard. It has been a real wake up call that - while the board is supposed to support the public opinion - this is not often the reality. It is very important that those elected to sit on the board are willing to not just listen to the public, but support and represent public opinion. Not dismiss or evade.

As I grew up on a farm in a large family, I know first hand the importance of strong community and small town community values. White City has been home for me and my family now for 11 years, and we are no strangers to Balgonie, Pilot Butte and surrounding area - particularly the rinks! Hockey is life! I have a personal vested interest in all of our surrounding communities - especially as we have two children that will be attending Greenall High school one day. Collectively we must work together for the betterment of our children - our future leaders. I would be delighted to get to know you better, and earn your vote!

GreenALL Equity Members Take Part in Awareness Walk

GreenALL Equity members, and other Greenall students, volunteered to spend October 4 participating in a walk for Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two-Spirit peoples. This was hosted by the RCMP Heritage Museum and included family members of victim’s families, RPS recruits, RSP members, Mayor Sandra Masters and Elders who guided us through our day. Our students also learned some teepee teachings, enjoyed a rap performance by Informed Bellegarde, and had a chance to do some sculpting inspired by the Red Dress movement. Greenall students were powerful student ambassadors on this very important day to draw attention about this tragic epidemic.



Reconciliation Presentation from Cadmus Delorme

Some of our grade 12 students recently travelled to Indian Head High School to join other PVSD schools to hear Cadmus Delorme speak about Reconciliation and his journey into celebrating his indigenous identity. He shared his engaging sense of humour and gift of storytelling with all of us in the room and reminded us that perseverance and patience is required for all of us to learn how to listen to one another and hear the uncomfortable histories we have all inherited together.

Law 30 Invites Former Student to Share

Law 30 would like to thank former Greenall graduate and now alumni, Logan Tonge, for coming to our class to discuss the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Logan talked about how challenging it can be for people living with exceptional needs, that need accommodations, to advocate for themselves – especially if they are non-verbal. His presentation gave our students insight into the experiences of a person with Cerebral Palsy and helped expand their perspectives.



Walk Down Memory Lane

Greenall's 2025 Outdoor School class hosted the first annual Walk Down Memory Lane at White Butte Trails on September 22. Over 80 participants came to the non-competitive walk to honour a loved one who is no longer with us. Outdoor School students worked as course marshals, as all voluntary proceeds will go towards the learning experiences for this year's ODS program. Donations were also made by Prairie Summit Shop and My Mutual Insurance. The staff and students are so appreciative of the community support they continue to receive and look forward to next year's event.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Transfer Station is set up with an electronic card system which allows residents to access it 24/7.

On the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month, Loraas Disposal delivers a 40-yard bin to the Transfer Station. The purpose of the 40-yard bin is to allow residents to dispose of additional household waste that does not fit in their black roll-out bin.

Unaccepted items

- Shingles;
- Railway ties, telephone poles and creosote treated wood;
- Bulbs and Light Ballasts;
- Hazardous materials such as tires, propane tanks, car batteries, paint, oil and chemicals;
- Appliances containing Freon;
- Construction/renovation material;
- Waste from households outside of Balgonie.

Please note: the unaccepted items listed above pertain to the 40-yard bin only. There are designated areas at the transfer station where some items listed above are accepted.

Who can use your transfer station card?

- Members of your household can use it.
- Lending your card out to another person and/or disposing of waste from households outside of Balgonie is not permitted.
- The cardholder will be held accountable for all occurrences at the transfer station, such as illegal dumping.

Illegal dumping

The Town of Balgonie has the responsibility to ensure regulations are followed based on the Approval to Operate issued to the Town by the Ministry of Environment.

Public Works Staff inspect the Transfer Station every morning. If it is determined that an illegal dump has taken place and/or items are placed in the incorrect disposal area, an investigation will commence. The resident at fault will be fined and their access card will be suspended for up to 6 months.

Disposing of large items

When residents dispose of large items such as couches, mattresses, and box springs in the 40-yard bin:

- it limits another resident's ability to dispose of their items in the bin;
- the bin is removed from the Transfer Station quicker, creating a longer waiting period for when it is scheduled to return.

In addition to the inconvenience it causes others by placing large items in the bin, the Town of Balgonie is required to pay a burial surcharge to Loraas Disposal if there are more than 4 pieces of bedding per load (mattresses and box springs), wood or metal longer than 7' or coils of wire or banding.

Designated disposal areas

Cement Pile

- Cement free of other debris may be disposed of.

Metal Pile

- All appliances and metal are permitted. Ensure the Freon is removed from fridges/freezers.
- Propane tanks are permitted.

Grass/Leaves

- Bags and boxes are not permitted in this pile.

Trees, Branches and Untreated Wood Pile

- Treated wood, painted wood, cardboard, drywall etc. are not permitted in this pile.

Oil Recycling Centre

- Empty oil into the oil recycling bin.
- Place the oil containers and filters in the bin next to the oil recycling bin.

Diabetes Canada Clothing Bin

- Do not leave bags beside the bin if it is full.

What should I recycle at SARCAN?

- Beverage containers
- Batteries
- Electronics
- Household paint
