Paying Tax & Utility Bills Online

Utility and tax bills may be paid through your online banking service. Please use **Balgonie (Town of) Taxes** for your taxes and **Balgonie (Town of) Utilities** for your water/sewer bills. If you are unsure of your account number, please contact the Town Office to obtain your account number.



When making an online payment, allow 2-3 business days before any due date so that your payment is receipted prior to any penalties being applied to your account.

Plastiq Payments

How to pay with Plastiq:

- 1. Go to www.townofbalgonie.ca
- 2. Scroll down to the right hand side of the screen.
- 3. Sign up create a free account, add who you are paying, and enter your card info.
- 4. Plastiq will process your payment and the funds will be transferred to the Town of Balgonie.

Fees associated with Plastiq are as follows:

- Standard credit card rate of 2.9%
- Debit cards are discounted to 1%

Loraas Disposal Bin at the Transfer Station

The red Loraas bin at the Transfer Station is delivered on the first and third Friday of every month. There is no specific time as to when the bin will arrive on these days. If a red bin is NOT available, do NOT leave any items where the bin is normally located. Residents have been fined (up to \$500) and their cards have been suspended.

Be courteous of others! Large items and multiple loads take up the entirety of the bin, making it unusable for other residents. If you have multiple large items, please take them to the Regina Landfill.

Home builders/developers are not permitted to use the red Loraas bin.

Reminder to Pet Owners

To be a responsible pet owner, remember to:

- 1. Walk your pet on a leash.
- 2. If your pet is aggressive, walk on the other side of the street away from people.
- 3. Pick up after your pet. There are multiple garbage cans located throughout the town for you to use.
- 1. Spay/neuter your pet.
- 2. License your pet at the Town Office. Fines are \$40 if a dog is found "at large".

Safety Reminders

Follow these safety tips to keep your home and property safe from theft/break-ins:

Light up your property - install motion detection lights or leave your lights on around entrances.

Have a security system - there are lots of options for wireless security systems with cameras. Keep an eye on your home when you're not there.

Advertise your security system - clearly advertise that your home is monitored. **Lock your doors and windows** - make a habit of locking home and cars doors before bed each night.

Make it look like someone is home - it is important for your home to look occupied even if you are not home. Leave a light on or get timers for your lights.

Report any and all suspicious activity, break-ins and erratic driving to the RCMP. Reporting these incidents lets the RCMP know where they need to have their staff monitoring. To report incidents:



2024 Financial Overview for Waterworks and Wastewater

The following is information for the Town of Balgonie waterworks as required under *The Municipalities Regulations*.

- > Total water and sewer revenues \$ 1.308,259
- Total waterworks and sewer expenses—\$1,448,391
- > Total debt repayment on waterworks and sewer infrastructure \$323,262
- Comparison of waterworks and sewer revenues to expenses, expressed as a ratio:
- \$\frac{1,308,259}{1,448,390} = .903

For 2024 waterworks and sewer revenues covered 90.3% percent of the waterworks and sewer expenses.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

September 30th, 2025

Each year, September 30th marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

The Town of Balgonie has passed a resolution in 2022 to close the office to honour the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The Town Office will be closed on Tuesday, September 30th. Our regular office hours will resume on Wednesday, October 1st.

Back to School!

Excited kids are back to school on Tuesday, September 2nd. This means our community and school zones will be busier. Please slow down to 30 km/hour, as indicated by the School Zone signs, and watch for kids crossing.



School Bus Safety

School bus drivers have a difficult job. There are plenty of distractions inside the bus. Knowing this, you should make extra allowances, and be aware of the possibility that the bus driver may not see you or your signals. Rearend collisions are the most frequent type of crash involving school buses and are usually caused by another driver failing to stop while the bus is loading or unloading passengers.

When approaching a school bus, if you see amber flashing lights, slow down and proceed with caution. If the red flashing lights are activated, you must come to a complete stop. If you're approaching the bus from the opposite direction on an undivided highway, you must also stop. The single greatest threat to the safety of children who ride school buses is motorists who pass the bus when children are loading and unloading.

When approaching a bus that has its stop arm out and its red flashing lights activated, as a driver:

- You must stop no closer than 5 m (15 ft) from the front or back of the bus.
- You must not advance your vehicle until the bus driver turns off the flashing red stop lamps and deactivates the stop arm.
- Before moving, check to see that all children have safely crossed the roadway.

Passing a school bus with red flashing lights is a serious offence and will result in a minimum fine of \$360.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ADOPT BYLAW NO. 480/2025

Public Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Town of Balgonie intends to adopt a Bylaw, under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007*, to amend Bylaw No. 374/2014, known as the Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT:

The proposed Bylaw will add the following as a discretionary use in the C1-Town Centre Commercial District:

(i) Manufacturing, fabricating, processing, repair, assembly, finishing, production, packaging, and sale of materials, goods or products that are not noxious.

REASON FOR THE AMENDMENT:

The Bylaw amendment will accommodate a proposed development on a site that is currently zoned C1-Town Centre Commercial District.

PUBLIC INSPECTION:

Any person may inspect the Bylaw at the Town of Balgonie Municipal Office Monday to Friday between 9:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. excluding statutory holidays. Copies are available at cost at the Town Office.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Council will hold a public hearing to receive submissions on the proposed Bylaw on September 22, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town of Balgonie Council Chambers. Council will also consider written submissions received at the hearing or delivered to the undersigned at the Municipal Office before the hearing. 

Elm Tree Care Reminder

To help prevent Dutch Elm Disease:

- Keep your elm trees healthy;
- Abide by the Provincial ban refrain from pruning elm trees from April 1st to August 31st;
- If you see signs of the disease, report them to the Town Office;
- Don't buy, sell, store or transport or use elm firewood; and
- Remove and dispose of disease-infected trees promptly and properly.



It is illegal to transport, store or buy elm firewood. Firewood is one of the largest spreaders of Dutch Elm Disease. Elm bark beetles on infected firewood hitch a ride with unsuspecting campers and homeowners, spreading the disease.

If you have elm wood that needs disposing of, please take it to the Transfer Station and place it in the tree pile.

Accepted Products:

Flammable Liquids

(Under 10L / 25L for Gas only)

- Must display the flammable symbol in an octagon.
- Examples: Acetone, BBQ lighter fluid, gasoline (in a ULC-approved can), paint thinner, etc.

Physically Hazardous

(Fuel cylinders non-refillable - under 5kg)

- Must display the flammable symbol in an octagon and the explosive symbol.
- Examples: Propane cylinders, camp fuel cylinders, MAPP gas torch fuel cylinders.

Aerosols

(Flammable, toxic, pesticides, and/or corrosive)

- Must display the explosive and flammable toxic poison or corrosive symbols in an octagon.
- Examples: Lubricant spray, glue, insect repellent, brake cleaner. (No cosmetic or beauty products.)

Toxic Liquids

(Under 10L)

- Must display the poison symbol in an octagon.
- Examples: Furniture stripper, automotive additives, lubricants.

Pesticides

(Liquids and solids - Under 10L/10Kg)

- Must display the poison symbol, a Pest Control Products number, and the word "Domestic."
- Examples: Yard & garden chemicals, antifouling paint, sanitizers.

Corrosive

(Liquids and solids - Under 10L/10Kg)

- Must display the corrosive symbol in an octagon.
- Examples: Rust remover, ammonia, bleach.





FLASHING RED LIGHTS ·····

STOP when flashing. DO NOT proceed until the lights stop flashing. If the lights begin flashing after you start crossing the tracks, keep going.

CROSSBUCK ······

YIELD if a train is approaching. Trains always have the right-of-way.

LOWERING GATES AND FLASHING RED LIGHTS ...

A train is approaching (even if you don't see it yet). DO NOT proceed until the lights turn off and the gates go up. It's illegal and dangerous to go around lowered gates.

MULTIPLE TRACKS ..

Multiple tracks are present. Multiple tracks may mean multiple trains. Wait until you can see clearly down the tracks in both directions before proceeding.





This is the first phone number to call if a vehicle is stuck or stalls on the tracks (this number may also be found on the signal house). You can also dial it to report people, vehicles or debris on the tracks, as well as damaged signs or signals, or obstructed views. The mile post and subdivision listed on the sign will help the railway to identify your location.



A large 'X' and a wide white line on the road mean you're approaching a railway crossing. Stay behind the white stop line while waiting for a train to pass. No stop line? Stop at least 5 metres from the nearest rail.

···· LOW GROUND CLEARANCE CROSSING

Raised crossing ahead. If you drive anything low to the ground — like a bus, truck, sports car or trailer — you're at risk of getting hung up on the tracks. DO NOT proceed until you know your vehicle will clear the tracks.

ADVANCE WARNING

Slow down, look, listen, and BE PREPARED TO STOP. Typically, this is the first sign you see when approaching a railway crossing.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Transfer Station is set up with an electronic card system which allows residents to access it 24/7.

On the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month, Loraas Disposal delivers a 40-yard bin to the Transfer Station. The purpose of the 40-yard bin is to allow residents to dispose of additional household waste that does not fit in their black roll-out bin.

Unaccepted items

- Shingles;
- Railway ties, telephone poles and creosote treated wood;
- · Bulbs and Light Ballasts;
- Hazardous materials such as tires, propane tanks, car batteries, paint, oil and chemicals;
- Appliances containing Freon;
- · Construction/renovation material;
- · Waste from households outside of Balgonie.

Please note: the unaccepted items listed above pertain to the 40-yard bin only. There are designated areas at the transfer station where some items listed above are accepted.

Who can use your transfer station card?

- · Members of your household can use it.
- Lending your card out to another person and/or disposing of waste from households outside of Balgonie is not permitted.
- The cardholder will be held accountable for all occurrences at the transfer station, such as illegal dumping.

Illegal dumping

The Town of Balgonie has the responsibility to ensure regulations are followed based on the Approval to Operate issued to the Town by the Ministry of Environment.

Public Works Staff inspect the Transfer Station every morning. If it is determined that an illegal dump has taken place and/or items are placed in the incorrect disposal area, an investigation will commence. The resident at fault will be fined and their access card will be suspended for up to 6 months.

Disposing of large items

When residents dispose of large items such as couches, mattresses, and box springs in the 40-yard bin:

- it limits another resident's ability to dispose of their items in the bin;
- the bin is removed from the Transfer Station quicker, creating a longer waiting period for when it is scheduled to return.

In addition to the inconvenience it causes others by placing large items in the bin, the Town of Balgonie is required to pay a burial surcharge to Loraas Disposal if there are more than 4 pieces of bedding per load (mattresses and box springs), wood or metal longer than 7' or coils of wire or banding.

Designated disposal areas

Cement Pile

Cement free of other debris may be disposed of.

Metal Pile

- All appliances and metal are permitted. Ensure the Freon is removed from fridges/freezers.
- Propane tanks are permitted.

Grass/Leaves

• Bags and boxes are not permitted in this pile.

Trees, Branches and Untreated Wood Pile

 Treated wood, painted wood, cardboard, drywall etc. are not permitted in this pile.

Oil Recycling Centre

- · Empty oil into the oil recycling bin.
- Place the oil containers and filters in the bin next to the oil recycling bin.

Diabetes Canada Clothing Bin

Do not leave bags beside the bin if it is full.
