Paying Tax & Utility Bills Online

Utility and tax bills may be paid through your online banking service. Please use **Balgonie (Town of) Taxes** for your taxes and **Balgonie (Town of) Utilities** for your water/sewer bills. If you are unsure of your account number, please contact the Town Office to obtain your account number.

When making an online payment, allow 2-3 business days before any due date so that your payment is receipted prior to any penalties being applied to your account.

Plastiq Payments

How to pay with Plastiq:

1. Go to www.townofbalgonie.ca
2. Scroll down to the right hand side of the screen.
3. Sign up - create a free account, add who you are paying, and enter your card info.
4. Plastiq will process your payment and the funds will be transferred to the Town of Balgonie.

Fees associated with Plastiq are as follows:

- Standard credit card rate of 2.9%
- Debit cards are discounted to 1%

Receive critical alerts and day-to-day notifications directly to your cell phone, email, or your home phone. Signing up is easy! Download the Voyent Alert app to receive alerts on your phone via the app or scan the QR code.



Community Safety Reminders

The Town of Balgonie, White Butte RCMP, Community Safety Officers and Greenall High School are working hard to keep our community a safe and inviting place to live and visit. Sometimes incidents are witnessed and should be documented and reported. Incidents that should be reported are reckless driving, vandalism, suspicious and/or illegal activity, etc. If you see this type of activity, please:

- Document the activity by taking pictures (if it is safe to do so) and/or noting description of the person (s) or vehicle (make, model, colour, license plate number).
- Fill out an Incident Report on-line at www.townofbalgonie.ca
- If the incident is regarding driving infractions, illegal activity, etc., please call the RCMP White Butte Detachment at 306-781-5050 with as much information as possible.
- If an incident involves a student’s behavior during the school day, please call Greenall High School at 306-771-2566.

Street Parking Reminder

Vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than 24 hours except on weekends and holidays. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property. All vehicles stored on your property must be licensed and in good repair. Storage of unlicensed and junked vehicles on your property are considered to be a “nuisance” by Town of Balgonie bylaws.



Elm Tree Pruning

The annual ban on pruning elm trees in Saskatchewan begins April 1. The ban helps slow down the spread of Dutch Elm Disease (DED). DED is a fungus spread by elm bark beetles. Pruning your trees before the ban keeps them healthy and better to resist all kinds of diseases.



Remember: It is illegal to use, transport, store or sell elm wood.

Snow Removal Reminder

The Town of Balgonie would like to remind residents that, to provide the best snow removal service, all unused vehicles are to be removed from Town streets, boulevards, and alleyways.

The Public Works Staff work hard to remove the snow. Piling snow or blowing your driveway onto the Town's roadways is not permitted. The extra snow also makes it hard for vehicles to pass. If you have private work done, the excess snow can be dumped at the two snow dumping sites in Balgonie (Greenall Street and Railway Street). A reminder that the use of quads to push snow to the other side of the street is not permitted.

Loraas Disposal Bin at the Transfer Station

The red Loraas bin at the Transfer Station is delivered on the first and third Friday of every month. There is no specific time as to when the bin will arrive on these days.

If a red bin is NOT available or is full, do NOT leave any items where the bin is normally located or add more to it. Residents have been fined (up to \$500) and their cards have been suspended.

Be courteous of others! Large items and multiple loads take up the entirety of the bin, making it unusable for other residents. If you have multiple large items, please take them to the Regina Landfill.

Home builders/developers are not permitted to use the red Loraas bin.


Balgonie 50+ Club





VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT WARREN THIELE



What group(s) do you volunteer with and how long have you been with these groups?

I have been a volunteer with the 1st Balgonie Beavers, Cubs, and Scouts for three and a half years. When I first joined, the group consisted of only 12 youth - primarily Beavers and a few Cubs. Since then, we have grown to 40 youth and successfully expanded to include a Scouts section. Our leadership team has also grown significantly, increasing from four Scouters (Adult Leaders) to twelve.

What do you enjoy most about volunteering?

The most fulfilling part of being a Scouter is witnessing the personal growth and development of the youth. They are given the chance to try new things and face unfamiliar challenges; with just a bit of guidance, it's rewarding to watch them realize exactly what they are capable of achieving.

What motivates you to stay involved?

I am constantly motivated by those "aha!" moments - when a young person is presented with a new challenge and discovers their own potential. Seeing them build confidence through hands-on experience is incredibly inspiring.

What have you learned through volunteering?


I've discovered that growth isn't just for the youth; Scouters have the opportunity to develop as well. Beyond honing my outdoor skills, I have gained valuable experience in leadership, people management, and program development.

What are some of your best moments in your capacity as a volunteer?

That's difficult to narrow down, as every camp provides lasting memories. However, the most inspiring moment was my first Area Kub Kar Rally. When the lead Scouter shouted, "Pack, Pack, Pack!" and over 100 Cub Scouts roared back "PAAAACCCCKKKK!" while swarming together to form a circle, the sense of scale and community was unforgettable.

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

Did you know that the **Town of Balgonie** receives an annual municipal revenue sharing grant from the Province of Saskatchewan? This is currently calculated on **2021 Census** population in our town—1756 residents. For 2025 to 2026, Balgonie’s rate is based on \$259.86 per capita (people living in Balgonie) plus a \$2,205 base rate for a total of \$458,519.

As this is a major source of funding for the Town, it is very important for **everyone** to complete the **2026 Census**. The revenue sharing grant will be based on this new census for several years. If the census is not complete, the grant revenue for Balgonie would be reduced.



ASSESSMENT 2026

WHAT IS PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT?

Tax assessment, or assessment, is the job of **determining the value**, and sometimes **determining the use, of property**, usually to calculate a property tax. This is usually done by an office called the assessor or tax assessor. The Town of Balgonie hires S.A.M.A. (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) to perform our assessments each year. If you have made changes to your property i.e. a new home, a new deck, basement development, etc., your property will be reassessed.

NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT

The Detailed Property Profile sheet, which you can request from the Town office (306) 771-2284, breaks down how your property was assessed. Please look at the Profile sheet and ensure there are no errors in the information.

PREPARING THE NOTICE OF APPEAL FORM

If you see an error in your Property Report, the Notice of Appeal form must be fully completed. You must provide specific grounds supporting the appeal. You are required to provide as many details as possible and all facts and evidence that an error has been made in the:

- valuation of the property;
- classification of the property;
- preparation of the relevant assessment roll or assessment notice; and/or
- content of the relevant assessment roll or assessment notice.

The grounds for the appeal must be detailed. Phrases such as “assessment too high” or “assessment too low” are **NOT** sufficient.

It is your responsibility to make a case to the Board of Revision. It may be as simple as proving that the “1930” shed is no longer standing, or proving that the dimensions or measurements are wrong, that a classification is not correct, or as complex as proving that the value of a property is not fairly assessed compared to another property that is similar in nature. The Town’s tax roll will be open for viewing for 30 days from the date of which is on your Notice of Assessment.

REGULAR ASSESSMENT APPEALS OR SIMPLIFIED ASSESSMENT APPEALS?

When making regular or simplified assessment appeals, the Notice of Appeal form must be fully completed. Regular appeal – the appellant must provide specific written grounds supporting the appeal when submitting it to the Secretary before the hearing. Simplified appeal - the appellant is not required to submit detailed written grounds to the secretary before the hearing but must have detailed information ready to present to the Appeal Board.

CAN I BASE MY APPEAL ON THE FACT THAT I FEEL MY TAXES ARE TOO HIGH?

NO! Legislation outlines the valid grounds for an appeal. Only your property assessment can be appealed, not the property taxes or the mill rates.

UNDERSTANDING ASSESSMENT - THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS AND ITS RELATION TO TAXES

S.A.M.A.'s role in determining assessed values for properties is just the first part of a process established by Provincial Legislation. The second part is the application of Provincial Government established tax policy, such as property classes, percentage of value, and statutory exemptions. The third and final part of the process involves a Provincial education mill rate, and the Town's mill rate, which is determined annually by the Town of Balgonie based on the Town's budget needs for the current year. The Town then multiplies the taxable assessment by these mill rates to determine your property tax bill. Therefore, property tax assessment is not the same as property taxes.



In addition to determining mill rates, the Town of Balgonie has the authority to apply a series of tax tools, such as mill rate factors by local property class, minimum tax, and base tax. These tax tools further affect the specific tax bill received by a taxpayer.

WHO CAN I CONTACT TO EXPLAIN MY ASSESSMENT?

You should start with your Administrator of your Municipality (Phone 306-771-2284). You can also call S.A.M.A. (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) (Phone 306-924-8000).

QUESTIONS FREQUENTLY ASKED REGARDING APPEALING YOUR PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

(The following questions and answers are taken from the pamphlet “Understanding the Property Assessment Appeal Process” from the Saskatchewan Government Relations, Provincial Municipal Relations and Advisory Services)

What is Property Assessment?

Property assessment is the process of determining a property’s assessed value as of a specific date for property tax purposes. The assessment provides an estimate of the property’s value that reflects typical market conditions.

Local governments use property assessments as a basis for the distribution of property taxes among property owners. Property assessment is not the same as property tax. The assessment of a property is the value assigned to it as the basis for allocating taxes among various classes of property.

Who Can I Contact to Explain My Assessment?

You should start with your Administrator of your Municipality (Phone 306-771-2284). You can also call SAMA (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) (Phone 306-924-8000) as it is the agency that performs Balgonie’s assessments; however, there may be a charge for this service.

Instructions

Creating a Public User Account

1. Go to www.mysama.ca
2. Click on **Don't have an account? Sign up now**, located below **Sign Up**.
3. Click on **Public User**. Commercial users (private appraisers, banks, businesses & realtors) must sign up for an Organization account.
4. Complete all **Sign Up** fields, click on **I'm Not a Robot**, then click **Sign Up**.
5. You will immediately receive a verification email from Portal Notification.
6. Click on **Please click here** to verify your email address.
7. You will be taken to the Public User Log In page. Re-enter your email and password.
You are all set to use MySAMA!

SAMAVIEW for Public Users

- The Public user has to sign up for a SAMAVIEW account. The account is free.
- Public users receive 25 free credits per revaluation cycle. Credits are only used when requesting a property report.
- SAMAVIEW can be used on mobile devices & computers. Chrome is the recommended browser.
- As with MySAMA, start typing in what you are searching for and then select it from the drop-down that will appear.
- Users can search by
 - Assessment ID (9 digit number, might be called alternate number on the user's assessment notice)
 - Legal land description, basic & advanced
 - Can do legal land description
 - ISC parcel number
 - Original quarter (most useful to people whose property was subdivided from a quarter section)
- Users can zoom in or out to view values for neighbouring properties.
- Once the user has selected the property and it appears under Property Results, they can click on General Property Overview to summarize the property's land and/or main buildings. This does not use credits.
- For more information, the user can click on Property Report. This uses a credit.







DID YOU KNOW?

The Transfer Station is set up with an electronic card system which allows residents to access it 24/7.

On the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month, Loraas Disposal delivers a 40-yard bin to the Transfer Station. The purpose of the 40-yard bin is to allow residents to dispose of additional household waste that does not fit in their black roll-out bin.

Unaccepted items

- Shingles;
- Railway ties, telephone poles and creosote treated wood;
- Bulbs and Light Ballasts;
- Hazardous materials such as tires, propane tanks, car batteries, paint, oil and chemicals;
- Appliances containing Freon;
- Construction/renovation material;
- Waste from households outside of Balgonie.

Please note: the unaccepted items listed above pertain to the 40-yard bin only. There are designated areas at the transfer station where some items listed above are accepted.

Who can use your transfer station card?

- Members of your household can use it.
- Lending your card out to another person and/or disposing of waste from households outside of Balgonie is not permitted.
- The cardholder will be held accountable for all occurrences at the transfer station, such as illegal dumping.

Illegal dumping

The Town of Balgonie has the responsibility to ensure regulations are followed based on the Approval to Operate issued to the Town by the Ministry of Environment.

Public Works Staff inspect the Transfer Station every morning. If it is determined that an illegal dump has taken place and/or items are placed in the incorrect disposal area, an investigation will commence. The resident at fault will be fined and their access card will be suspended for up to 6 months.

Disposing of large items

When residents dispose of large items such as couches, mattresses, and box springs in the 40-yard bin:

- it limits another resident's ability to dispose of their items in the bin;
- the bin is removed from the Transfer Station quicker, creating a longer waiting period for when it is scheduled to return.

In addition to the inconvenience it causes others by placing large items in the bin, the Town of Balgonie is required to pay a burial surcharge to Loraas Disposal if there are more than 4 pieces of bedding per load (mattresses and box springs), wood or metal longer than 7' or coils of wire or banding.

Designated disposal areas

Cement Pile

- Cement free of other debris may be disposed of.

Metal Pile

- All appliances and metal are permitted. Ensure the Freon is removed from fridges/freezers.
- Propane tanks are permitted.

Grass/Leaves

- Bags and boxes are not permitted in this pile.

Trees, Branches and Untreated Wood Pile

- Treated wood, painted wood, cardboard, drywall etc. are not permitted in this pile.

Oil Recycling Centre

- Empty oil into the oil recycling bin.
- Place the oil containers and filters in the bin next to the oil recycling bin.

Diabetes Canada Clothing Bin

- Do not leave bags beside the bin if it is full.

What should I recycle at SARCAN?

- Beverage containers
- Batteries
- Electronics
- Household paint
