

**TOWN OF BALGONIE  
BYLAW NO. 400/2017**

**A BYLAW TO REGULATE VEHICLE WEIGHTS TO 5 TONNES FOR  
A ROAD WITHIN THE TOWN OF BALGONIE IN ACCORDANCE  
WITH SECTION 18 OF THE MUNICIPALITIES ACT**

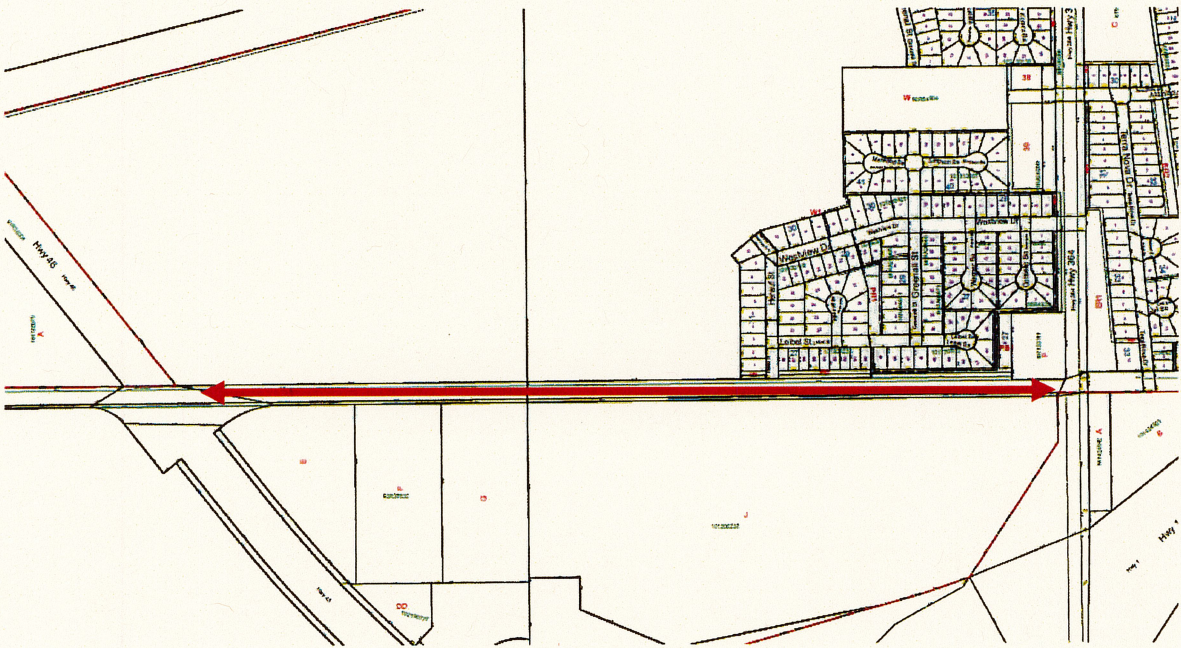
The Council of the Town of Balgonie, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. In this Bylaw the expression:
  - (a) "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Municipality, appointed pursuant to Section 2 of The Municipalities Act; and
  - (b) "Minister" means the Member of the Executive Council to whom for the time being the administration of The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997, is assigned.
  - (c) "public highway" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997 but shall not include a provincial highway as designated in pursuance of such Act:
  - (d) "vehicle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997.
  - (e) "registered gross weight" shall mean the gross weight specified in the certificate of registration of the vehicle issued pursuant to The Traffic Safety Act and proof of financial responsibility as provided for and in conformity with the requirements of The Traffic Safety Act.
2. No person shall operate, or move or cause to be operated or moved on or over, a motor vehicle at a registered gross vehicle weight greater than 5 tonnes on the following public highway within the boundaries of the Town of Balgonie which is shown in Appendix A; located in NE and NW 33-17-17-W2M; which has the surface parcel numbers of 110347545 and 110347534 with Information Services Corporation with a western limit of Highway 46 and an eastern limit of Highway 364. This road is to be named Gibson Road.
3. Signs indicating the weight restriction shall be erected at the each end of the restricted zone.
4. Notwithstanding Section 2 of this Bylaw, the Administrator may, if satisfied that the vehicle can be operated or moved upon the public highway without damage to the highway exempt the owner of the vehicle or combination or vehicles to exceed the maximum gross vehicle weights fixed by this Bylaw for municipal vehicles and vehicles providing service to the municipality (i.e. garbage trucks, sewage vac trucks).
5. Notwithstanding Section 2 of this Bylaw, the Administrator may, if satisfied that the vehicle can be operated or moved upon the public highway without damage to the highway, issue a one-time permit to the owner of the vehicle to exceed the maximum gross vehicle weights fixed by this Bylaw where the vehicle is used to provide service to a resident within one of the above-mentioned residential subdivisions.
6. Notwithstanding Section: 2 of this Bylaw, the Administrator may, if satisfied that the vehicle can be operated or moved upon the public highway without damage to the highway, issue a yearly permit to the owner of the vehicle to exceed the maximum gross vehicle weights fixed by this Bylaw up to a maximum of 15 tonnes where the vehicle is for personal or business use of a resident within one of the above-mentioned residential subdivisions.



Appendix A:

Road with 5 tonne limit restriction:





7. (a) A person contravening any provisions of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and is liable to a penalty of \$0.25 per kg over weight.
- (b) A person contravening any provisions of this Bylaw with three or more offences shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality.
- (c) A person contravening any provisions of this Bylaw who has been served with a summons ticket and who wishes to plead guilty and pay a voluntary payment within 14 days of the date of the summons ticket, may deliver the summons and an amount equal to 50% of the specified penalty sum for the offence to a place indicated on the summons ticket on or before the date specified on the summons.
8. Bylaw #398/2017 and amendments thereto are hereby repealed.
9. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of the final reading and approval of Council.
