### **SNOW REMOVAL:**



As we are entering into the winter season, we need to be prepared for the SNOW which is likely to arrive. Our Town is fortunate to have great staff to clear our streets for us!! This time consuming job is made a lot easier when vehicles are moved off the streets for the graders to come through. As well, the Town Boulevard areas (the first 12-15 feet of each property) where the snow is placed, need to be free of vehicles and trailers.

The main streets are done first, followed by side streets and alleys are last. Depending on the severity of the storm and amount of snow, it may take a while for all streets to be cleared. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

#### **ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS:**

Taxes and utility bills may be paid electronically through your online banking website. The payments would be under Town of Balgonie Taxes and Town of Balgonie Utilities.

(Do not choose Balgonie Water—this payee is a previous business and is not connected with the Town of Balgonie.)

Please contact the Town office to obtain your account numbers.

Electronic payments for utilities and taxes are a convenient way to pay your bills, but they are not instantaneous. Please allow 2-3 business days before any due date so that your payment is receipted by our office before any penalties apply. The bank requires time to process the payment and advise the Town.

The receipts for electronic payments will be available for pickup, mailed or emailed upon request.

### **Reminder to Balgonie Residents:**

Vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than 24 hours except weekends and holidays. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property. All vehicles stored on your property must be licensed and in good repair. Storage of unlicensed and junked vehicles on your property are considered to be a "nuisance" by Town of Balgonie Bylaws.

#### **Description**:

Branch Librarians are responsible for the operation of the local library branch. They perform a variety of clerical tasks of a responsible nature requiring knowledge of branch library procedures as established by the regional library headquarters. They use computer equipment for communications, searching, circulation functions, record keeping and reporting. They assist patrons in finding resources/information. They receive direction and training from their supervisor and work with considerable independence. Throughout their work, and particularly in serving the public, they are required to exercise judgment based on knowledge of the organization of the regional library and its policies and procedures. They supervise assistants and report to their branch supervisor or designate. They work in conjunction with their local library board, however they answer to their Southeast Regional Library supervisor.

#### **Typical Duties:**

Carry out all aspects of prescribed circulation, and registration procedures using computer equipment.

Assist patrons in the use of library resources and equipment.

Shelve library materials and maintain orderly shelves and storage areas.

Carry out procedures for the regular exchange and transfer of library resources.

Under the direction of branch supervisor or designate, hire and supervise assistants.

Supervise the use of the public library computers.

Keep all necessary statistics and desk receipts and provide reports to HQ and/or the local library board as required.

Supervise the use of the library space, equipment and furnishings.

Maintain orderly and safe branch library service.

Act as secretary (non-voting) of the local library board.

Assist the local library board in organizing and running library programs within scheduled work times on a time availability basis. Assist the local library board in promoting the library within scheduled work times.

In consultation with the local library board and as directed by HQ, select appropriate paperbacks and periodicals for the branch collection.

Other duties as assigned by their branch supervisor or designate.

Qualifications:

Grade XII or equivalent; accuracy in keeping records; good organizational skills; minimum typing ability of 30 wpm with a maximum error rate of 2%; functional literacy skills, interest in using library resources, along with demonstrated oral and written communication skills; good working knowledge of spelling, composition and arithmetic; ability to work independently; ability to establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with staff, trustees, and the general public; maintain the confidence and support of the local library board; the ability to display judgment and tact when dealing with the general public; ability to operate library and computer equipment; physical fitness allowing the lifting and moving of boxes/bins of library materials (up to 50 pounds); must be bondable; ability and willingness to attend and participate in workshop inservice and training sessions.

# POST ON FRIDGE AND REVIEW RECYCLING INFORMATION

#### Tips to reduce your household waste and reduce impact on Landfills:

#### **REDUCE:**

- Purchase items with less packaging and excess cardboard and plastic.
- Use reusable items rather than disposable—cloth grocery bags, cloth napkins, cloth diapers.
- "Pre-cycle" as much as you can—reduce household waste by attempting to avoid bringing in items which generate waste into home or business.
- Purchase items in packaging made from recycled materials.
- Purchase consumables in bulk to reduce packaging.
- Purchase the amount that you need, you won't have leftover things to throw away by leaving the excess at the store and in your pocketbook.
- Buy long life or concentrated versions of products. This saves on packaging and product.
- Sign up for electronic bills, catalogues, newspapers and magazines.
- Buy quality items rather that ones that will break or be unusable and end up in the landfill.
- Compact and reduce the size of the items you are going to throw away in the trash.

#### **REUSE:**

- Repurpose old items, research a new and creative way to repurpose and old items.
- Paint, fix, repair or mend items instead of throwing items away.
- Sell used items on Used Regina, Used Facebook sites, consignment stores or through local contacts.
- ♦ Have a garage sale.
- Donate clothing, furniture and other items to charities: Habitat for Humanity Re-Store, Salvation Army, Community Living, Diabetes Foundation, Open Door Society and there are many others.

#### **RECYCLE:**

- These items can be taken to a Sarcan depot for recycling. Check out www.sarcan.ca
- ◆ Electronics
- ♦ Paint
- Deposit containers (empty and lids removed off pop/water bottles, pop cans, juice boxes)
- Milk jugs and cartons

Checkout www.saskwastereductions.ca for businesses that accept items to recycle. These range from batteries, cellphones, to paint and tires. Best Buy, Future Shop, London Drugs and Staples accept used electronics and toner cartridges.

Crown Shred will recycle glass at a charge of \$5 per box.

The Town of Balgonie has a used oil recycling depot, it is available at the town shop during business hours.

# REMEMBER CHECK THE RECYCLING LIST!!!



Many residents are recycling and reducing the amount of household waste that goes to the landfill. We can even do better by making sure everyone in the household is checking labels before tossing items into the trash.

Things that can go into your blue curbside recycling carts in Balgonie.



# Styrofoam or other foam packing materials can Now be Recycled

- <u>Cardboard and Paper:</u> Cardboard and paperboard such as empty laundry detergent boxes, cereal boxes, tissue boxes, shoe boxes, chocolate boxes, paper and cardboard packaging from Christmas gifts, newspapers, flyers, inserts, junk mail and envelopes, magazines, catalogues, telephone books, paperback books, hardcover books with spines removed, paper bags, toilet paper and paper towel cores, gift and packing paper, paper egg cartons, copier paper, and NCR paper (No carbon required).
- <u>Aluminum & Tin:</u> Soft drink and beer cans, foil trays and pie plates, and household tin cans. These items should be rinsed before placing in recycling bin.
- <u>Plastic:</u> Containers with logo 1-7, plastic bags, plastic drink bottles and plastic wrap. This would include things like: packaging from toys and electronics, lids from milk jugs and soda bottles, shampoo bottles, hair-spray, lotion, cleaning bottles, empty salad dressing bottles, mayonnaise bottles.
- Aseptic Packaging and Cartons: Juice and milk cartons, milk jugs, tetrapak containers, pouches.

# Sorry, we do not accept the following in the Loraas Single Stream Recycling carts.

- Glass
- Household garbage, organics, or hazardous waste
- Waxed plasticized or food contaminated paper, cardboard cups or plastic plates
- Soiled tissues, napkins and paper towels
- Confetti shredded paper
- Auto parts or batteries

How should you prepare recyclables before putting them in the bin?

Flatten all cardboard boxes. Wash and rinse all food and beverage containers. Remove all lids and caps from containers.

# Get Ahead of the Winter Freeze

It's not too early to begin preparing for the heating season. Check these 10 tips off your list and get ahead of the winter freeze.

Our <b>furnace has been inspected and serviced</b> by a qualified professional during the last 12 months. (A furnace should be serviced at least once a year.)
Our <b>chimneys and vents have been cleaned and inspected</b> by a qualified professional. I have checked for creosote built-up. (Not cleaning your chimney is the leading cause of chimney fires from built up creosote. This service needs to be done at least once a year.)
Our wood for our fireplace or wood stove is dry, seasoned wood.
Our <b>fireplace screen is metal or heat-tempered glass</b> , in good condition and secure in its position in front of the fireplace.
We have a <b>covered metal container</b> ready to use to dispose cooled ashes. (The ash container should be kept at least 10 feet from the home and any nearby buildings.)
Our children know to stay at least <b>3 feet away</b> from the fireplace, wood/pellet stove, oil stove or other space heaters.
Our portable space heaters have an automatic shut-off.
Our portable space heaters will be <b>plugged directly into an outlet</b> (not an extension cord) and placed at least three feet from anything that can burn; like bedding, paper, walls, and even people. (Place notes throughout your home to remind you to turn off portable heaters when you leave a room or go to bed.)
We have <b>tested our smoke alarms</b> and made sure they are working. (You need smoke alarms on every level of the home, inside each sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. For the best protection, the smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.)
We have tested our carbon monoxide alarms and made sure they are working. (Carbon monoxide alarms should be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.)
