

# Household Smoke Detector Safety and Disposal

#### June 2013

Household smoke detectors, also referred to as ionization chamber smoke detectors, use radioactive material to sense smoke in the air and warn of fire hazards. The radiation source in these smoke detectors is usually a small amount of americium-241 that does not pose a risk to the user of the smoke detector.

#### How do ionization chamber smoke detectors work?

The americium-241 in ionization chamber smoke detectors makes the air in the detector's sensing chamber conduct electricity. When smoke enters the sensing chamber, it interrupts the electrical current, triggering the smoke detector's alarm.

# Is the radiation from ionization chamber smoke detectors dangerous?

The radiation source in ionization chamber smoke detectors is sandwiched between metal foils, which keep the radioactive material well contained.



The tiny amount of radiation that can be measured outside the unit does not pose any health risk. In fact, the average annual radiation dose a person receives from a smoke detector is 0.01% of the dose they receive from natural background radiation.

#### **Quick Facts**

- Smoke detectors can be disposed of in household garbage.
- Smoke detectors do not pose any health risk.
- The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) licenses the manufacturing and initial distribution of smoke detectors in Canada.
- Smoke detectors must comply with standards that involve approximately one hundred individual tests

### How do I dispose of my household smoke detector?

You can dispose of your household smoke detectors in regular municipal household garbage, but not in recycling or composting waste.

### What if I have multiple detectors to dispose of?

There is no limit on the total number of smoke detectors that can be disposed of at one time.

# What is the role of the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission?

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) licenses the manufacturing and initial distribution of ionization chamber



smoke detectors in Canada. All smoke detectors containing a radioactive source sold within Canada are approved on a model-by-model basis and must meet the radiation safety standards before being distributed.

The CNSC regulates the use of nuclear energy and materials to protect the health, safety and security of Canadians and the environment, and to respect Canada's international commitments on the peaceful use of nuclear energy.

# A message from the RM of Edenwold

#### Frame the vision

Starting in March, the RM of Edenwold will be asking ratepayers to, once again, share their vision for the future. Public consultations will be held via stakeholder engagement meetings and online surveys/ questionnaires leading to an update of the Official Community Plan.



"Public meetings will be the first of many steps to engage our residents and businesses, in both our rural and urban areas," says Senior Municipal Planner Jana Jedlic. Ratepayers are also encouraged to write letters and send emails to their councillors with their future hopes for the RM. The current Official Community Plan was released in 2010 and the RM has seen exponential growth since.

"We want to hear what is working, what people like and what changes or types of growth they want to see in and for the future," says Jedlic. "The OCP will frame the vision for the RM, which will be implemented through the regulations in the zoning bylaw."

#### On the path

More walking paths are coming for Emerald Park.

"Emerald Park residents are active residents, they like to walk!" says Planner/Development Officer Paige Phillips. "We heard concerns about safety for those walking along Great Plains Road. Through our relationship with the Ministry of Highways, we were able to secure a commitment from them to work on a pathway design to fit next to the road." Jedlic added that a future phase will see a pathway connection between Great Plains Road and South Plains Road.



#### On deck in 2017

Currently, three industrial developments are in the approval process with the RM, queries have been made about residential developments

north of Highways 1 and 46 and a new washroom/storage facility at the Emerald Park soccer field is in the works. It was announced in October the WCRM158 Waste Water Authority's wastewater treatment project (a cooperative project between the RM/White City) has received approval in principle from both the federal and provincial governments through the Building Canada Fund.

#### See the license? Shop local!

The December launch of the RM of Edenwold's new business licence program resulted in quick initial take-up with over 100 business licence applications already returned. The information gathered - to date - reveals over 1,637 employees work at RM businesses. For business owners, the RM offers to promote the businesses on their website and hopes to offer business-focused networking opportunities and co-branded print promotion in the future. For the RM, the returned applications result in valuable statistics. "It helps ensure our record keeping is up-to-date, including employment numbers," Phillips said. "These statistics clearly reveal the RM's growth and help us plan future infrastructure. We continue to research and have conversations about public transportation options. With the information provided by RM businesses, we have real numbers to work with when dealing with provincial and federal agencies." Printed business license certificates will be sent out for local businesses to display.

#### Celebrating Canada 150

Reeve Mitchell Huber has signed on to be a Community Leader volunteer with the Federation of Canadian Municipalities during Canada 150 celebrations. "The RM has a long and proud history," says Huber. "I believe everyone within the RM is happy to celebrate Canada's milestone anniversary and the part the RM of Edenwold has in that."





## Balgonie Volunteer Fire Department

# A Year In Review

Your local volunteer fire fighters and medical first responders feel it is important to let our community members know what we have achieved and been up to in 2016!

The Balgonie Volunteer Department is made up of 27 members. Of those 27 members, 11 are trained in firefighting and 15 are trained in firefighting and emergency medical response. We also have 1 junior member (junior members are youth aged 15-18 years old who take the same training but cannot respond to activations until they are 18 years old). The third Wednesday of each month, the fire fighters get together to train and practice. Some of the practices are driving, using air packs, using Jaws, ladder handling etc. In nice months you will probably see us training in the field beside the fire hall.

In 2016, our members attended 1 fire school and hosted the spring fire school. Fire schools are hosted by volunteer departments where approx. 200-300 volunteer firefighters from across the province, attend to receive training. Did you know.... Volunteer firefighters in Saskatchewan receive the same training and certification as career firefighters? We are very fortunate in Balgonie that we have 7 North American certified Fire Service Instructors on our department.

In January 2017, we had 10 of our First Responders take an advanced course in Trauma Life Support. This will better aid us with our patients who have traumatic injuries like those from car accidents, falls, etc. Volunteer Medical First Responders are trained through our health district to attend to patients while we wait for an ambulance to arrive. Given that the ambulance usually comes from Regina (sometimes Indian Head) there can be a wait time for the ambulance. We will arrive first and attend to the patient until the ambulance arrives.

In 2016, Balgonie Volunteer Department attended to 104 calls between the town of Balgonie and the RM.: Fire calls-10, First Responder calls-46,False Alarms-12, Other-3 and MVC's (motor vehicle crashes) – 33.

If you think you would like to join our team, please contact Chief Dave Campbell or come down to the fire hall the first Wednesday of each month as we have our monthly meeting. We are also available for fire hall tours and any public education you need.
