





Notice of Intention to Amend The Zoning Bylaw.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the Town of Balgonie proposes to amend the Zoning Bylaw No. 374/14 as follows:

Lot 7, Block 1, Plan 16960 be rezoned from C-1 Downtown to CS-Community Services.

Section 4 General Regulations, Subsection 4.23 Communication Towers is amended by changing the following to read:

The erection of cellular telephone transmission towers shall not be permitted in, or closer than 50 metres (164.04 feet) of any Residential district.

Lots 4, 5 & 6, Block 1, Plan 16960 be rezoned from Residential Medium Density to C1-Downtown.

REASON: The reason for the amendment is to allow SaskTel to install a taller communication tower as an accessory structure in a CS –Community Services district to support the cellular and data requirements of our community and surrounding area; and rezoning Lots 4, 5, & 6, Block 1 would allow for these properties to be more desirable for commercial development.

A public hearing on the proposed amendments will be held in the Town of Balgonie Council Chambers, 7:00 P.M., November 14, 2016.

Anyone may attend the public hearing and speak to Bylaw 393/2016. The proposed Bylaw may be viewed at the Town Office during regular office hours at any time up to and including the date of the public hearing. For further information, contact Town of Balgonie at (306) 771-2284.






White Butte Pharmacy will be offering **Flu shots** this Fall starting October 31^{st.}

ALLOWEEN FIRE SAFETY T

- When choosing a costume, stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so they can see out.
- **Provide children** with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper catch fire easily. Keep all decorations away from open flames and other heat sources like light bulbs and heaters.
-))) Use a battery-operated candle or glow-stick in jack-olanterns. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-olanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.
- **Remember** to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- **Make sure** all smoke alarms in the home are working.
- >>> Tell children to stay away from open flames including jack-o-lanterns with candles in them. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. (Have them practice, stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.)

If your children are going to Halloween parties at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.

Decorations are the first thing to ignite in 900 reported home fires each year. Two of every five of these fires were started by a candle.
