

BALGONIE SWIMMING POOL


The pool has closed for yet another season. Thank you to all the patrons who came out to the pool this year. The Balgonie Swimming Pool Board would like to thank the following:

TOWN COUNCIL MEETINGS are open to the public. They are regularly scheduled on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of every month starting at 6:15 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Balgonie Administration Building.

Reminder to Balgonie Residents:

Vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than 24 hours, except weekends and holidays. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property.

All vehicles stored on your property must be licensed and in good repair. Storage of unlicensed and junked vehicles on your property are considered to be a "nuisance" by Town of Balgonie Bylaws.

ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS:

Taxes and utility bills may be paid electronically through your online banking website. The payments would be under Town of Balgonie Taxes and Town of Balgonie Utilities.

(Do not choose Balgonie Water—this payee is a previous business and is not connected with the Town of Balgonie.)

Please contact the Town office to obtain your account numbers.

Electronic payments for utilities and taxes are a convenient way to pay your bills, but they are not

instantaneous. Please allow 2-3 business days before any due date so that your payment is receipted by our office before any penalties apply. The bank requires time to process the payment and advise the Town.

Lorne Harasen coming to our library Oct 8 - 10:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m.

Lorne Harasen writes his broadcast memoir

One of Saskatchewan's longest serving broadcasters, Lorne Harasen, has written his career memoir. Entitled: The Harasen Line, a Broadcaster's Memoir, the 269-page book outlines the adventures and highlights of a career that exceeded 50 years. Harasen began his career as a staff announcer at CJGX Yorkton.

78-year-old Harasen, a member of the Canadian Association of Broadcasters Half Century Club, began his career at CJGX Yorkton and continued on at CFQC Saskatoon, CKCK, CKRM and CKCK Television in Regina. He was a respected journalist who covered some of the biggest news stories and most important institutions in Saskatchewan. Lorne Harasen's work earned him major national awards including the Lifetime Achievement Award when it was introduced by the Radio Television News Directors Association of Canada in 2003.

Perhaps best known for hosting open line radio on CKCK and CKRM for almost 30 years The Harasen Line attracted some of the highest audience numbers in Saskatchewan radio history. The book includes accounts of the good, bad, hilarious and even gut wrenching and scary times. Harasen also has some pointed things to say about the broadcast news media.

The memoir includes a section on some of his countless guests, famous and infamous, some of his most celebrated interviews, transcribed, with such people as Bing Crosby, separatist Rene Levesque, New Orleans District Attorney, Jim Garrison, and Academy Award actor, Jack Lemmon. It also includes a look at Saskatchewan's changing attitudes and even a section on the Roughriders as well as a picture gallery.

Besides carrying a heavy broadcast load Lorne Harasen also found time to serve his church and community as a school trustee, a director and activity chair of the Saskatchewan Roughriders for almost 45 years, as a supporter of veterans causes and as a fundraiser for charitable and community needs throughout the province.

The author will be making appearances for book signings in book stores, public libraries and other events. Lorne Harasen will participate in a book event in the Balgonie Public Library on Saturday October 8 between 10am and 2pm. His book will be available then for those wishing to purchase.

Halloween Safety



Choose the right costume

- Use make up or face paint instead of masks, before you use the make up—do a test patch to make sure you are not allergic or sensitive to it.
- Improperly fitting masks can interfere with children's vision, if you choose a mask, make sure it fits properly and allows them to see properly
- Avoid costumes that are too big and have long dangling pieces that children can trip over.
- Nylon or heavyweight polyester costumes are best. Remember, that flame resistant does not mean fire proof.

Avoid Danger when decorating

- Check indoor and outdoor decorative lights for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires or loose connections. Do not overload extension cords.
- Instead of using candles, consider using a small flashlight or battery operated candles to light jack-o-lanterns.

Stay secure while trick or treating

- Give each child a flashlight to carry, to make themselves more visible to others.
- Make sure children look both ways and cross intersections when no cars are coming.
- Tell children to stay in well lit areas and only visit homes that have their outside lights turned on, make sure they know never to go inside homes or cars.

Be cautious with candy and toys

- Tell children not to eat any treats until you have looked them over.
- Be careful when giving children any treats that could be a potential choking hazards such as chewy candies, peanuts and other hard candies.

VOTER ID

As of March 2012 new requirements for voter identification for local government elections are in effect similar to those in place for federal and provincial elections. Those wishing to vote will be required to present identification at the polling stations in order to receive a ballot.

Bringing proper identification will ensure your voice is heard and will help your local election run as smoothly as possible. Photo identification is your best option but there are other alternatives available to you.

The purpose of the voter ID requirements is to maintain the integrity of local election processes. Your name and address must appear in some form on your voter identification documents.

Photo ID Is Your BEST Option

Acceptable photo identification is ID that is government-issued, valid and has your photo, name and address. Examples include:

- A valid Saskatchewan Driver's Licence.
- A valid Saskatchewan ID card issued by SGI or any motor licence issuer.
- Any other valid government issued photo ID issued by a Canadian government whether federal, provincial or municipal, or an agency of that government, so long as it includes your name and address.





THE CAMPING & SUMMER SEASON HAS SADLY COME TO AN END. PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT ALL CAMPERS, TRAILERS, RECREATION VEHICLES, BOATS, ETC. ARE PROPERLY STORED FOR THE UPCOMING SEASON. PLEASE MAKE ANY NECESSARY ARRANGEMENTS NEEDED, TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE NOT ON TOWN PROPERTY.





ON BALGONIE STREETS, THE SPEED LIMIT IS 40KM/HR., UNLESS YOU ARE IN THE SCHOOL ZONE WHICH IS MARKED AT 30KM/HR. THE SIGNS ARE LOCATED AT THE CORNERS OF MAIN ST. & ASSINIBOIA ST. AND ALSO MAIN ST. & QU'APPELLE ST.

WE HAVE HAD A SPEED REDUCTION ON THE WESTVIEW GRAVEL ROAD, BETWEEN HIGHWAY 364 AND HERAUF ST. THE SPEED LIMIT IS 40KM/HOUR, AFTER THAT TO HIGHWAY 46 THE SPEED LIMIT IS 80KM/HR.

This road is for local traffic only.

PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THE HIGHWAY #1 SPEED LIMIT HAS BEEN REDUCED TO 60 & 80KM/HOUR FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE BYPASS PROJECT. AS WELL AS ON HIGHWAY 46, THERE IS A SPEED REDUCTION AROUND PILOT BUTTE FROM 100KM/HOUR TO 80KM/HR.




